
STATEMENT OF
PRINCIPAL REASONS
FOR ADOPTION

The Environmental Quality Council issued public notice, provided for public comment, and conducted public hearings on the captioned proposed regulations before initiating adoption on July 25, 1985 (and adoption of a Statement of Reasons on September 4, 1985).

In response to a concern expressed by the Legislative Management Council staff that the rules were not filed within 60 days of adoption as required by W.S. 16-3-104(a), the Environmental Quality Council determined that to be prudent, it should readopt the previously adopted regulations.

The Environmental Quality Council readopted on March 26, 1986, the regulations on Clean Air Resource Allocation Expiration which were previously adopted by the Council on July 25, 1985. This readoption is based on the record compiled for the initial adoption. The Statement of Reasons for the initial adoption dated September 4, 1985 is also readopted by this action.
