The Dry Fork Plant is subject to Prevention of Significant. Deterioration regulations. The anticipated degree of increment consumption for sulfin dioxide (SO2), particulate matter (PMIO) and nitrogen dioxide (NO2) is as follows:

The Class II increment consumption attributable to the Dry Fork plant is esti-mated to be 16%, 5%, 3%, 4% and 2% of the allowable increments for 24-hour PM10, annual PM10, annual NO2, 3-hour SO2 and annual SO2, respectively.
