Thank you for the opportunity to respond to the petition put forward by the Citizens United for Responsible Energy Development (CURED) and the residents of Sublette County.

The Wyoming Department of Health is charged with protecting the health of all Wyoming residents. Many factors need to be considered when setting air quality standards. From a health perspective, less exposure to ozone leads to a better quality of life. Based on the best available scientific information, the Department believes it is in the best interest of Wyoming residents to have the lowest possible ozone standard.

The Wyoming Department of Health also believes there should be a statewide uniform standard.
