HISTORY

Authorization for a Limited Mining Operation of one acre was issued to George M. Allen on September 22, 1983. The authorization was modified to a maximum disturbance of 10 acres on July 16, 1998. The surface owner of the 487ET permitted area is River Meadows, Inc. The bond held by LQD for the reclamation of the disturbance is \$8,400.00. The operation was last inspected on July 17, 2006. The Limited Mining Operation is located eight miles south of Saratoga at the junction of State roads 130 and 230. The legal description is the NW1/4SW1/4 Section 16, Township 16 North, Range 83 West & the NE1/4SE1/4 Section 17, Township 16 North, Range 83 West.

Sand and gravel is listed as the mineral to be mined. It is expected that the disturbance that will require seeding will be larger than 10 acres. The disturbance has been graded to LQD requirements previously. The disturbance was seeded in 2003 but the lack of topsoil and the drought has hindered all vegetation seeding. The bond is felt to be adequate to reseed the reclamation area with a drill seeder.

The area where this Limited Mining Operation is located was mined previously by the Wyoming Department of Transportation (WDOT).

Chronology of Events

<u>April 4, 2007</u> The Rawlins National Bank letter informed LQD that the George's letter of Credit would not be renewed.

April 9, 2007 LQD notified the Rawlins National Bank that the Division would be presenting the letter of credit for payment on June 8, 2007 if a replacement bond was in place at that time.

April 12, 2007 LQD received a call from Winifred Allen, Mrs. George Allen, who had received her copy of the LQD letter dated April 9, 2007. Mrs. Allen informed LQD that George had passed away last winter and she did not have the means to complete the reclamation or keep paying for the letter of credit. She was asked if she would sign a voluntary bond forfeiture agreement. She stated that she would and that she just wanted out of any responsibility concerning her husband's business.

I. General Discussion and Annual Report Review

HISTORY

Authorization for a Limited Mining Operation of one acre was issued to George M. Allen on September 22, 1983. The authorization was modified to a maximum disturbance of 10 acres on July 16, 1998. The surface owner of the 487ET permitted area is River Meadows, Inc. The bond held by LQD for the reclamation of the disturbance is \$3,400.00. The operation was last inspected on July 19, 2005. The Limited Mining Operation is located eight miles south of Saratoga at the junction of State roads 130 and 230. The Limited Mining Operation was last GPS surveyed during the 1999 inspection.

INTRODUCTION

LQD received the 2004-2005 Annual Report (AR) on August 11, 2005 and the report covers the time period from September 22, 2004 through September 21, 2005. This report indicates that the mine was reclaimed in May of 2005.

- No disturbance occurred during the report period and the total disturbance was reclaimed.
- The operator has submitted soil sampling details, fertilizer data that was used and the seed mix that was used.. The operator used the soil samples to determine what seed mix and fertilizer should be used to ensure re-vegetation. The report indicates that interseeding was completed on May 24, 2005.

II **Field Inspection**

- A. The permit identification sign was in place at the time of the inspection.
- B. Access to the Limited Mining Operation is from the east side of Highway 230. The access road serves two Limited Mining Operations, 487ET and Saratoga Corporation, 585ET. The 585ET is on the west end of the disturbed area and you must pass through it to reach the 487ET operation.

- C. The site was not active at the time of the inspection. All stockpiles and equipment have been removed from the permit area. Drill rows from the latest seeding were noted (See photo #1). The topsoil that was available was replaced on the south end of the disturbance and vegetation establishment was notably better in this area (See photo #2).
- D. Some areas within the 487ET permit area were disturbed prior to the permitting of this Limited Mining Operation in 1983. Topsoil was not salvaged during the prior mining and is not available for reclamation use. The lack of topsoil and the method of seeding, broadcast seeding on compacted spoil, may require several years before vegetation will establish to LQD standards and bond release can be granted.
- **E.** Runoff from the disturbed lands is controlled by the pit. Some erosion was noted on the entry road that services both 487ET and 558ET.
- F. The disturbance is very close to or may have exceeded the maximum 10 acres allowed in a Limited Mining Operation. The Limited Mining Operation was GPS surveyed during the 1999 inspection at 16.5 acres. The 16.5 acres included some native areas and common areas (Marked in green on 1999 GPS maps) between the 585ET permit.

III Compliance Assessment

A. Vegetation has not established to LQD standards. The Wyoming Environmental Quality Act, 35-11-415(b)(viii), requires the operator to "Replace native or superior self regenerating vegetation on land affected." LQD will inspect the vegetation establishment after the second growing season in June of 2007.




Photo No. 2. Vegetation establishment in the south reclaimed area is starting to establish.

HISTORY

Authorization for a Limited Mining Operation of one acre was issued to George M. Allen on September 22, 1983. The authorization was modified to a maximum disturbance of 10 acres on July 16, 1998. The surface owner of the 487ET permitted area is River Meadows, Inc. The bond held by LQD for the reclamation of the disturbance is \$3,400.00. The operation was last inspected on July 22, 2004. The Limited Mining Operation is located eight miles south of Saratoga at the junction of State roads 130 and 230. The Limited Mining Operation was last GPS surveyed during the 1999 inspection.

INTRODUCTION

LQD received the 2003-2004 Annual Report (AR) on September 8, 2004 and the report covers the time period from September 22, 2003 through September 21, 2004. This report indicates that the mine was active, 200 yards of mineral mined during the report period.

- No disturbance occurred during the report period and the total disturbance line was not filled out. Past Annual Reports and inspections indicate that 10 or more acres have been disturbed.
- The report indicates that no reclamation has been completed.
- The report indicates that no topsoil or overburden is available for use in reclamation.
- Line #12 of the report indicates that seeding occurred in October of 2003 with a High Plains Seed mix.

II **Field Inspection**

The permit identification sign was in place at the time of the inspection. A.

- **B.** Access to the Limited Mining Operation is from the east side of Highway 230. The access road serves two Limited Mining Operations, 487ET and Saratoga Corporation, 585ET. The 585ET is on the west end of the disturbed area and you must pass through it to reach the 487ET operation.
- C. The site was not active at the time of the inspection. All stockpiles and equipment have been removed from the permit area. The disturbance has been cleaned up and all grading has been completed since the last inspection (See photo #1). The topsoil that was available has been replaced on the south end of the disturbance and that area of the reclamation was broadcast seeded in the fall of 2003.
- D. Some areas within the 487ET permit area were disturbed prior to the permitting of this Limited Mining Operation in 1983. Topsoil was not salvaged during the prior mining and is not available for reclamation use. No vegetation has yet established from the seeding that was completed in years 2000 and 2003 (See photos #1). The lack of topsoil and the method of seeding, broadcast seeding on compacted spoil, may require several years before vegetation establish to LQD standards and bond release can be granted.
- **E.** Runoff from the disturbed lands is controlled by the pit. Some erosion was noted on the entry road that services both 487ET and 558ET.
- F. The disturbance is very close to or may have exceeded the maximum 10 acres allowed in a Limited Mining Operation. The Limited Mining Operation was GPS surveyed during the 1999 inspection at 16.5 acres. The 16.5 acres included some native areas and common areas (Marked in green on 1999 GPS maps) between the 585ET permit. LQD will require the Limited Mining Operation be upgraded to a Small Mining Application before further disturbance can occur.

III Compliance Assessment

A. It is possible that this Limited Mining Operation may have exceeded the maximum of ten acres that is allowed in a Limited Mining Operation. No further disturbance can occur and reclamation of the disturbance must be completed.



Bond Forfeiture for George's Excavation, 487ET – (Voluntary Forfeiture)

George's Excavation has failed to complete the reclamation of this Limited Mining Operation. The Operator, Mr. George Allen, is now deceased. His widow, Mrs. Winifred Allen is not able to complete the reclamation both from a physical and financial aspect. Because of this inability to complete the reclamation, Mrs. Allen has signed a voluntary forfeiture.

The LQD inspection on July 17, 2006 confirmed that the vegetation is not sufficient for bond release. It is formally request that the Department accepts the voluntary bond forfeiture and proceed with the forfeiture for the reclamation bonds of \$8400 held for 487ET.
