Second Public Notice
 Lost Creek ISR, LLC of Casper Wyoming has applied for an in situ mining permit from the Land Quality Division of the Wyoming Department of Environmental Quality (WDEQ). The mining permit area will be located in all or parts of Sections 13, 24 and 25 of Township 25 North Range 93 West and all or parts of Sections 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 29, 30 and 31 of Township 25 North, Range 92 West, at the intersection of the Antelope Reservoir, Osborne Well, Sooner Reservoir and Battle Spring USGS 7.5' Topographic Quadrangle Maps, Sweetwater County, Wyoming. The Lost Creek Project area is approximately 1.5 miles southwest of the community of Barroil. The proposed operation is scheduled to begin November of 2011 and is estimated to continue until the year 2022.
 The land, after mining, will be returned to rangeland. The groundwater to be affected by the operation will be reclassified to Class V (Uranium commercial) in accordance with WDEQ Water Quality Division Regulations, Chapter VIII, upon issuance of this permit. This classification includes the ore zones presently identified for production and extends approximately 1/4 mile beyond the projected wellfield perimeter monitor wells in accordance with WDEQ LQD Chapter 11 Regulations and based upon a groundwater model and the demonstration of the ability to control mining fluids. The groundwater, after mining, will be restored to a quality of use equal to or better than and consistent with pre-mining uses.
 Information regarding the proposed mining operation and reclamation/restoration procedures may be reviewed in the offices of the Land Quality Division of the Department of Environmental Quality in Cheyenne and Lander, the office of Lost Creek ISR, LLC at 5880 Enterprise Drive, Suite 200 Casper, Wyoming, or the Sweetwater County Clerk's Office in Green River, Wyoming. Upon request by an interested party, the Land Quality Division may schedule a public meeting to discuss the application. If such a meeting is scheduled, it must be prior to the date for the close of public comments. If concerns about the permit are not resolved by the Land Quality Division, written objections or comments on the proposed mining operation and groundwater classification must be received by the Administrator, Land Quality Division of the Department of Environmental Quality, Herschler Building, 122 West 25th Street, Cheyenne, WY 82002, before the close of business 30 days after the last publication (The last date of publication will be May 25, 2011) as required in W.S. §35-11-406(k).

If any written objections are received, a public hearing shall be held within twenty (20) days after the final date for filing objections, unless a different period is stipulated to by the parties. The Environmental Quality Council or the Director shall publish notice of the time, date, and location of the hearing in a newspaper of general circulation in the locality of the proposed operation once a week for two (2) consecutive weeks immediately prior to the hearing. The hearing shall be conducted as a contested case in accordance with Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act (W.S. §16-3115), and the right of judicial review shall be provided as afforded in that act. All parties as given in W.S. §35-11-406(j) will be mailed a copy of this notice. The Wyoming Oil and Gas Conservation Commission will be mailed a copy of the application mine plan map as required in W.S. §35-11-406(j).
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
