The owner of the mine has proven to be a nuisance to our community by burning waste without authorization during the permit process.

According to Wyoming Statue 35-11-406, subsection (m), (vii), the director can deny a permit if the mine is deemed a public nuisance. The definition of public nuisance as defined by English Law is "an act not warranted by law, or an ommission to discharge a legal duty, which act or ommission obstructs or causes inconvienience or damage to the public in the exercise of rights common to all His Majesty's subjects."

- 1. The hours of operation in our community will violate our right to enjoy our land due to the volume of noise pollution.
- 2. The mine will affect the value of the properties in the community which is deemed a "node of development."
- 3. The location within a scool zone is hazardous to the public due to traffic and overlaping hours of operation.
- 4. The noise level will damage the quality of recreational activity along the river which is an economic value to our community. This area is deemed recreational.

Stewardship of Wyoming's shared resources is our concern.
