**MOTION TO DISMISS SELECTED PARTIES**

Croell Redi-Mix, Inc., [Croell] by and through its undersigned counsel, submits herewith its Motion to Dismiss Selected Parties from the above captioned matter. As grounds therefore, Croell states as follows:

**I.     Facts and Posture of the Case**

1. Pursuant to WYO. STAT. § 35-11-406(j), public notice of Croell's application for a mining permit in Johnson County, Wyoming (TFN 5 1/189) was published in the Buffalo Bulletin, a newspaper of general circulation in the locality of the proposed mining site once per week for four (4) weeks beginning on April 19, 2012.
2. Pursuant to WYO. STAT. § 35-11-406(k), letters objecting to the permit application were submitted by Protestants Troy and Hanna Ehrmantraut, Jacob Gay, Fred Mathews, Steve Wurthier, Dan Gay, Jerry Ruby, Larry Brannian & Family, Chuck & Jody Evitt, and Cory Jensen.
3. By letters dated May 11, 2012, the Protestants were notified that the Environmental Quality Council (EQC) considered the Protestants letters to be objections to the issuance of the permit and informed the Protestants that the matter would be set for hearing before the EQC as a contested case hearing.


4. Pursuant to WYO. STAT. § 35-11-406(k) and with the stipulation of the Protestants, DEQ, and Croell, the matter was set for hearing on July 12, 2012.
5. On June 18, 2012, the EQC issued its Notice of Hearing and Order providing notice to the parties of the hearing date and location, and that a prehearing conference would be held on June 22, 2012 at 3:00 via telephone conference. (Ex. A). The parties were ordered to inform the EQC office of a direct telephone number by which they could be reached for the prehearing conference and were informed that the purpose of the prehearing was to identify witnesses and the substance of their testimony, to clarify both the substantive and procedural issues, including identification of the statutory and regulatory bases of the objections, to stipulate to uncontested facts, the marking and identification of exhibits, and motions. *Id.* The Notice of Hearing and Order also informed the parties that “Failure to appear at the prehearing conference may result in dismissal from the case.” *Id.*
6. On June 18, 2012 Cory Jensen withdrew his objection.
7. On June 22, 2012, the prehearing conference was held. DEQ, Croell, Ehrmantrauts (through counsel), Jacob Gay and Fred Mathews were the only parties in attendance.
8. The parties agreed that issues considered at the hearing would be limited to those encompassed by WYO. STAT. § 35-11-406(m)(viii) (Ex. B, 6:15 - 7:24).
9. Protestant Jacob Gay informed the parties at the prehearing conference that he would not attend the hearing, that he would not present witnesses or testify on his own behalf, and would not submit any exhibits. (Ex. B, 11:25 – 12:10, 15:1 – 15:14).
10. Protestant Fred Mathews informed the parties at the prehearing that he would attend the hearing by telephone, if available, and testify on his own behalf, but would not attend in person, and would not present any witnesses or exhibits. (Ex. B, 12:11 – 14:4).
11. On June 29, 2012, Ehrmantrauts withdrew their objection to issuance of the permit. (Ex. C).

## II. Argument

The June 18, 2012 Notice of Hearing and Order informed all parties that failure to appear at the June 22, 2012 prehearing conference may result in dismissal. This notice was provided to all parties who submitted comments on the proposed permit. Pursuant to the General Rules of Practice and Procedure of the Environmental Quality Council, Section 9(b), the Stipulated Agreement for Final Hearing arising from the prehearing conference controls the hearing in the matter. That Agreement limits the witnesses and exhibits to be presented at the hearing to those identified by the parties in attendance at the prehearing conference. As Fred Mathews is the Protestant who has indicated that he will present any evidence, it is appropriate to dismiss all parties that failed to appear at the prehearing conference or to otherwise offer any evidence in opposition to the Permit.

Pursuant to the Agreement and Section 9(b) of the Rules of Practice and Procedure, Protestants Jacob Gay, Steve Wurthier, Dan Gay, Jerry Ruby, Larry Brannian & Family, Chuck & Jody Evitt should be dismissed from the action. Additionally, because Protestants Cory Jensen and Troy and Hanna Ehrmantraut have withdrawn their objections, they too should be dismissed. A proposed order dismissing these Protestants is provided herewith.



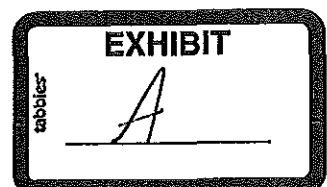
**NOTICE OF HEARING AND ORDER**

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT:**

1. The Environmental Quality Council (the Council) will conduct a hearing on Thursday July, 12, 2012 at the Herschler Building, Room 1699, 122 W 25<sup>th</sup> St., Cheyenne Wyoming. The hearing will commence at 9:00 a.m. This hearing will be conducted as a contested case hearing under the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act. F. David Searle, a member of the Council will serve as Presiding Officer.
2. This hearing is held pursuant to Sections 35-11-101 through 35-11-1904, W.S. 2010, as amended, regulations promulgated there under, and the Department of Environmental Quality Rules of Practice and Procedure.
3. Croell Redi-Mix Inc., (Croell) applied for a small mining permit from the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ).
4. Croell and the DEQ contend the permit application is complete and should be granted.
5. The Protestants objected to Croell's small mining permit. The particular statutes and rules upon which the Protestants base their objections have not been specified at this time.
6. This matter was scheduled in accordance with the time limitations set forth in Wyo. Stat. § 35-11-406(k). The schedule can only be adjusted at the request and the filing of a joint stipulation and motion for continuance.

**NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN THAT:**

1. A prehearing conference in this matter will be conducted on Friday June 22, 2012 at 3:00 p.m. via telephone conference call. The parties shall inform the EQC office of a direct telephone number and if possible an email address where they can be reached for the prehearing on or before 4:00 p.m. June 21, 2012. Failure to appear at the prehearing conference may result in dismissal from this case.
2. The purpose of the prehearing conference is:
  - a. Identification of witnesses, their addresses, phone numbers, and the





- substance of their proposed testimony;
- b. Clarification of the legal issues, both substantive and procedural, of all the parties, including identification of the statutory provisions and regulations that form the basis of the appeal;
  - c. Stipulation to uncontested facts;
  - d. Examination and marking of proposed exhibits and entering into stipulations to the foundation and admissibility of the exhibits and testimony; and
  - e. Motions.
3. In accordance with the DEQ Rules of Practice and Procedure, Chapter 1, Section 6, "Unless otherwise agreed to by the parties and consented to by the Council, all hearings, including all testimony, shall be reported verbatim by a competent reporter. The compensation of such reporter shall be paid as required by law and as ordered by the Council. The Council may direct any party or parties to assume the cost of the transcript." If the Parties do not file a waiver to this section, the DEQ should pay the costs of the transcript.

**ORDER**

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:**

1. All parties shall appear at the prehearing conference call on Friday June 22, 2012 at 3:00 p.m. via telephone conference call. The parties shall inform the EQC office of a direct telephone number and if possible an email address where they can be reached for the prehearing on or before 4:00 p.m. June 21, 2012. Failure to appear at the prehearing conference may result in dismissal from this case.
2. All parties shall appear on Thursday, July 12, 2012 to present evidence. Failure to appear at the hearing will result in dismissal from the case.
3. A court reporter will transcribe the hearing. The DEQ shall pay for the transcripts.
4. No continuances, concerning the prehearing conference, shall be granted unless a motion showing good cause for the continuance is filed with the EQC no later than 12:00 noon on June 21, 2012 and the Presiding Officer finds that good cause has been shown.



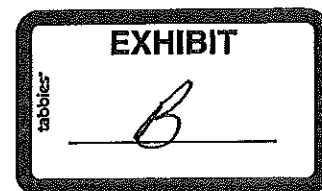

1 don't. We don't -- we're not immediately close relatives
