RE: Very Rare or Uncommon Designation for Adobe Town and Surrounding Area.

To Whom It May Concern:

I am sorry that I will be unable to attend the public hearings on the "Very Rare or Uncommon" petition for Adobe Town; there fore I am offering these comments by letter.

I have been to the Adobe Town Wilderness Study Area, and the surrounding unprotected sites outside the Wilderness Study Area. This whole area is unique and deserves protection by whatever means possible. Sometimes the status of Wilderness Study Area can change to a non protected status, so I would like the whole area (Adobe Town, the Hay Stacks, The Willow Creek Rim and Badlands, The Flats at the Base of the Skull Creek Rim and the Powder Rim) protected from industrial use and designated as Very Rare or Uncommon places and afforded the protection this status would grant them.

I have made a photo book of our trip to this area several years ago, and sent it to Erik Molvar. If it gets to him in time for the hearings and he is able to bring it, I think it will show how a visitor is awed by the beauty and uniqueness of this area. I am especially interested in the needs of wildlife and how they would be impacted by industrial use.

Please do what you can to preserve this special place from industrial development.
