STATUS REPORT OF FRONTIER REFINING INC. IN RESPONSE TO PRESIDING OFFICER'S REQUEST AT JUNE 11, 2007 PROCEEDING

COMES NOW Frontier Refining Inc. ("Frontier") by and through its undersigned counsel, and submits the following status report as requested by the Presiding Officer at the June 11, 2007 proceeding:

- 1. On August 3, 2007, the Wyoming Environmental Quality Council ("EQC") sent out a notice to all parties scheduling the Joint Motion to Approve Joint Stipulation for Modification of Administrative Order on Consent for August 29, 2007.
- 2. There has been no agreement among Frontier, the Department of Environmental Quality ("DEQ"), and Arp & Hammond Hardware Company ("A & H") regarding the Joint Stipulation For Modification of Administrative Order on Consent dated September 15, 2006 ("Joint Stipulation"). (Hereinafter, Frontier, the DEQ, and A & H will be collectively referred to as the "Participants" since A & H has not been admitted as a party to this proceeding.)
- 3. Following the June 11, 2007 proceeding before the Presiding Officer in this matter, and after informal discussions with Mr. Barrash, counsel to the DEQ, Frontier awaited comments from the DEQ on Frontier's proposed remediation plan for Porter

Draw Reservoir ("Frontier Remediation Plan"). (Frontier had submitted its Remediation Plan to the DEQ on May 1, 2007 and supplemented it on May 14, 2007). Frontier understood that DEQ's comments would serve to establish a starting place for further discussions among the Participants on a possible three-way settlement.

- 4. On June 25, 2007, DEQ provided comments to Frontier on Frontier's Remediation Plan and also requested modifications to that plan. DEQ's comments appeared to reflect comments previously submitted by Casey Resources, Inc., A&H's technical consultant, on Frontier's Remediation Plan. On July 31, 2007, Frontier provided responses to DEQ's request for modifications to the Frontier Remediation Plan,
- 5. In response to a request from Frontier (and apparently one or more of the other Participants), Mr. John Corra, Director of DEQ, sent a letter dated July 11, 2007 to all Participants to schedule a meeting among the Participants to discuss a resolution of their differences relative to the Frontier Remediation Plan. (Mr. Corra's letter is attached hereto as Exhibit A.) By letter dated July 19, 2007, a copy of which was provided to counsel for A&H, Frontier expressed an interest in attending such a meeting, although Frontier's counsel is not aware of any similar expressions of interest by A&H. (A copy of Frontier's letter is attached hereto as Exhibit B.).
- 6. On August 2, 2007, DEQ sent a letter to Frontier, A&H and the City of Cheyenne inviting the recipients to an August 23, 2007 meeting at DEQ offices to "review the status and see if we can agree on a path forward." (A copy of DEQ's letter is attached hereto as Exhibit C.) Frontier plans to attend this meeting.
- 7. As indicated above, Frontier has cooperated with DEQ in connection with the Frontier Remediation Plan and has expressed a willingness to meet with all Participants

to explore a resolution of differences. Although, as indicated in Paragraph 6 above, a meeting between the Participants has been scheduled for August 23, 2007, no previous meetings between the Participants have been held.

- 8. On August 6, 2007 counsel for A & H sent a letter to the EQC notifying EQC that he would not attend the August 29, 2007 EQC meeting with DEQ and Frontier. (A copy of counsel's letter is attached hereto as Exhibit D.)
- 9. The DEQ and Frontier Motion for Entry of the Joint Stipulation was filed on October 17, 2006. That motion, which is a consent item, has now been pending before this Council without final action for almost one year.





Dear: Mr. Wiederspahn, Mr. Wilkenfeld, Mr. Lewis and Mr. Faudel:

The purpose of this letter is to invite you to meet with me and my Water Quality and Solid and Hazardous Waste staff to discuss the status and issues concerning the plan requirements relating to the Joint Stipulation to Modify Administrative Order on Consent. That Joint Stipulation, along with the March 1995 Final Administrative Order on Consent, (AOC), requires that Frontier Refining, Inc. develop plans and environmental indicators that address exiting pollution as well as the prevention of future pollution to areas including Crow Creek and Porter Draw. This matter carries significant implications for all three addressees, as well as the DEQ. I will ask my secretary, Laura Laughlin, to begin to work with your representatives to schedule a date and time.

Both Arp and Hammond and Frontier have approached me about meeting in the hopes of working out an agreement that addresses the current barriers between the parties to developing the plans and carrying out the work called for in those plans. The City is invited, as it has a role to play regarding pollution exiting a storm sewer drain near the refinery. It is apparent that the intended date for clean-up of that problem has now been postponed indefinitely. Additionally, the city may be interested in the broad scope of this issue, and what alternatives are being considered by the landowners and the refinery.

DEO intends to uphold the terms of the Joint Stipulation and AOC. We will also be examining the alternatives that we see in accomplishing this goal and will be prepared to discuss these with you at the meeting. I intend to conduct the meeting in a way that clearly outlines the





barriers and possible ways these barriers can be eliminated. Your willingness to come prepared to resolve the issues will ensure that we are successful.


Dear: Mr. Wiederspahn, Mr. Wilkenfeld, Mr. Lewis and Mr. Faudel:

Based upon our discussions, it appears that a meeting with all of the parties may be productive. As you know, we have several compliance and clean-up matters that are pending, a deadline coming up concerning plans for remediation of certain sources of contamination and an expectation from the Environmental Quality Council (EQC) that we can find a mutually agreed upon path forward. Based on my impressions of the concerns raised by Arp & Hammond and Frontier Refining, I am inviting you to attend a meeting with DEQ to review the status and see if we can agree on a path forward. The City is invited because of their plans to relocate the existing storm drain and the associated discharges from the storm sewer adjacent to the refinery.

The meeting is scheduled for Thursday, August 23, at 1:30 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. in my office, 122 W. 25th Street, Herschler, 4th floor, west wing. Please let me know at your earliest opportunity if this date will fit with your schedule.

Also, please review the following proposed agenda for our meeting:

- 1. Summary of Issues. Each party, including DEQ, should spend about five minutes describing what its interests are and what objectives they intend to pursue over the coming months.
- 2. Discuss what we believe to be the expectations of the Environmental Quality Council (EQC) for their August meeting.





- 3. Current Status from the perspective of each party. Where we are relative to the stipulated schedule and what are the barriers to completion.
- 4. Clarify the party's views for both Porter Draw and the property adjacent to the refinery.
- 5. Identify common ground, discuss our respective roles, and discuss whether we can develop a joint report to EQC.

If anyone on the route list has an addition or wishes to modify this one, please let me know.
