## RESPONSE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY TO THE PETITION OF THE WYOMING OUTDOOR COUNCIL

The Department of Environmental Quality(DEQ)/Water Quality Division (WQD) by and through its attorney, John S. Burbridge, Senior Assistant Attorney General, hereby responds to Wyoming Outdoor Council's (WOC) appeal of the reclassification of three drainages to Crazy Woman Creek and their tributaries and states to the Environmental Quality Council (EQC) the following:

- 1. WOC has failed to show that it has standing to appeal the reclassification and downgrading of the drainages to Crazy Woman Creek and their tributaries, as no member of WOC that is directly affected by the DEQ's action has been listed in its Petition. As such, the EQC should dismiss WOC's Petition for lack of standing.
  - 2. The DEQ admits paragraph 1 of WOC's Petition.
- 3. The DEQ states that its Rules of Practice and Procedure cited by WOC in paragraph 2 of its Petition speak for themselves.

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- 4. The DEQ admits paragraph 3 of WOC's Petition.
- 5. The DEQ is without sufficient knowledge to either admit or deny the assertions contained in paragraph 4 of WOC's Petition.
- 6. The DEQ states that it considered the "Use Attainability Analysis Kennedy Oil South Area Addition Johnson County, August 3, 2005," its own analysis of the three drainages to Crazy Woman Creek (Kennedy South Area Addition), and public comments on the proposal to reclassify the drainages.
  - 7. The DEQ admits paragraph 6 of WOC's Petition.
- 8. The DEQ admits the second and third sentences of WOC's Petition, but denies the allegation made in the first sentence of paragraph 7 of WOC's Petition.
  - 9. The DEQ denies the allegations made in paragraph 8 of WOC's Petition.
- 10. The DEQ is without sufficient knowledge to either admit or deny the allegations contained in paragraph 9 of WOC's Petition.
- 11. The DEQ is without sufficient knowledge to either admit or deny the allegations contained in paragraph10 of WOC's Petition.
  - 12. The DEQ denies the allegation made in paragraph 11 of WOC's Petition.
- 13. The Use Attainability Analysis (UAA) is used by the DEQ to determine whether the default aquatic life designation is appropriate and does not attempt to evaluate the effects of future discharges in its reclassification process as alleged in paragraph 12 of WOC's Petition.

- 14. The DEQ denies WOC's allegations contained in paragraph 13 of its Petition.
- 15. The DEQ denies WOC's allegations contained in paragraph 14 of its Petition.
- 16. The DEQ denies WOC's allegations contained in paragraph 15 of its Petition.
- 17. The DEQ denies WOC's allegations contained in paragraph 16 of its Petition.
- 18. The DEQ denies each and every allegation not specifically admitted to in this response.
