


C. Both general permits do not comply with the requirements of Chapter 2, Section 4, Wyoming Water Quality Rules and Regulations, in that they do not meet the requirements for general permits. Specifically, they both have different categories of discharges, with different effluent limitations, and provide for different monitoring requirements, all within the same permit.

D. The Petitioner has filed a Memorandum of Support, with Exhibits, attached hereto, setting forth the legal and factual basis for its claims herein.

WHEREFORE, the Petitioner moves that the Environmental Quality Council grant this Motion for Summary Judgment and further moves that the EQC grant such other and further relief as the EQC may deem just and equitable.


